

CHAPTER VI.

OF ACADEMIC DRESS.

(Under Chap. IV, Sec. 4 of the Statutes.)

1. Professors, lecturers and students are required to wear academic dress at lectures, except in those cases in which a dispensation shall have been granted by the Faculty.

2. Undergraduates shall wear a plain black stuff gown, not falling below the knee, with round sleeve cut above the elbow.

3. *Bachelor of Arts*.—Black stuff gown, falling below knee, with full sleeve cut to elbow and terminating in a point (similar to that of the Cambridge B.A.); hood: black silk, lined with pale blue silk and edged with white fur.

4. *Bachelor of Science*.—The same gown as Bachelors of Arts; hood: black silk, lined with yellow silk and edged with white fur.

5. *Bachelor of Civil Law*.—The same gown as Bachelors of Arts; hood: black silk, lined with French grey silk and edged with white fur.

6. *Master of Arts*.—Black gown of stuff or silk falling below knee, with long sleeve with semi-circular cut at the bottom (similar to that of the Cambridge M.A.); hood: black silk, lined with pale blue silk.

7. *Master of Science*.—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: black silk, lined with yellow silk.

8. *Doctor of Medicine*.—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: scarlet cloth, lined with dark blue silk.

9. *Doctor of Laws*.—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: scarlet cloth, lined with white silk.

10. *Doctor of Literature*.—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: scarlet cloth, lined with pale blue silk.

11. *Doctor of Science*.—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: scarlet cloth, lined with yellow silk.

12. *Doctor of Civil Law*.—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: scarlet cloth, lined with French grey silk.
