REGULATIONS OF CORPORATION

CHAPTER VI.

OF ACADEMIC DRESS.

(Under Chap. IV, Sec. 4 of the Statutes.)

I. Professors, lecturers and students are required to wear academic dress at lectures, except in those cases in which a dispensation shall have been granted by the Faculty.

2. Undergraduates shall wear a plain black stuff gown, not falling below the knee, with round sleeve cut above the elbow.

3. Bachelor of Arts.—Black stuff gown, falling below kn., with full sleeve cut to elbow and terminating in a point (similar to that of the Cambridge B.A.); hood: black silk, lined with pale blue silk and edged with white fur.

4. *Bachelor of Science.*—The same gown as Bachelors of Arts; hood: black silk, lined with yellow silk and edged with white fur.

5. Bachelor of Civil Law.—The same gown as Bachelors of Arts; hood: black silk, lined with French grey silk and edged with white fur.

6. Master of Arts.—Black gown of stuff or silk falling below knee, with long sleeve with semi-eircular cut at the bottom (similar to that of the Cambridge M.A.); hood: black silk, hined with pale blue silk.

7. *Master of Science.*—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: black silk, lined with yellow silk.

8. *Doctor of Medicine.*—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: scarlet eloth, lined with dark blue silk.

9. Doctor of Laws.—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: searlet eloth, lined with white silk.

10. Doctor of Literature.—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: searlet cloth, lined with pale blue silk.

II. Doctor of Science.—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: searlet cloth, lined with yellow silk.

12. Doctor of Civil Law.—The same gown as Masters of Arts; hood: scarlet eloth, lined with French grey silk.

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
