While there are other objects to which the liberality of educational benefactors may be directed, the above are especially indicated as those which would give relief in the present financial exigency.

It is the earnest wish and intention of the Board of Governors to reserve the whole of the present College Grounds for educational purposes in connection with the University, provided that the amounts now to be subscribed should prove sufficient to enable it to take this course.

The names of all donors will be entered and maintained on the published list of Benefactors of the University.

The Governors would earnestly invite the attention of their fellow-citizens to this appeal, as relating to an object which they believe to be of paramount importance. They hope at an early date to take a public opportunity of giving more full explanations to the friends of the University, and in the mean time they will be glad to afford any further information which may be desired as to its present financial position, and as to the precise directions in which aid is most urgently required.
