FRO'! THE NEW BRUNSWICK GENERAL CONFFRENCE OF

E CHRISTIAN BAPTISTS, "

IN SESSION AT STUDHOLM, Oct. 15th, 1849, TO THEIR PRETHREN COMPOSING THE CHURCHES OF THAT NAME THROUGHOUT THE

PROVINCE.

DEARLY BELOVED .- Grace be to you, and peace from God the Fether, and from our Lord Jesus Christ, who gave himself for our sins, that he might deliver us from this present evil world, according to the will of God, and our Fether: to whom be glory for ever and evor, emen. (Gal. i. 3, 4, 5.) We do not forget former days; we cherish the remembrance of those season. many of us formerly enjoyed together-the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace (Eph. iv. 3.) in which we dwelt. We remember-it is only as yesterday-we were oll deed in trespasses and sins, wherein in times pest we walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience. (ch ii. 1, 2.) But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us, even when we were dead in sins, quickened us together with Christ, and we have set together in heavenly places in him, (ver. 4, 5, 6,) end thus we have together been made joyful in the Lord. We would not, brethren, be negligent to put you always in remembrance of these things, (2 Peter, i: 12,) celling to mind our former caeness in the Lord. Many of you were beggotten in Units Jesus by some of us through the gospel. (1 Cor. 1v: 15.) This causes our care towards you to abound, and we watch for your souls as they that must give account. (Heb xiii: 17.) We think we can appeal to Heaven-now we live, if ye stand fost in the Lord. (I Then iii: 8.) But we are not ignorant of the devices of Satan, (2 Cor. ii: 11.) neither would we be slow to charge and edmonish you to beware of him, who is transformed into an angel of light, (ch. xi: 14.) For we fear, least by any means, as the servent beguiled Eve through his subtlety, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ; (ver. 3.) For this cause we address you.

We segret to hear uf anything being introduced among ns, which would mor or check that anity of the spiritthat charity, or love, which is the bond of perfectness. (Col. iii: 14.) We are sorry to know that some of on brethren have fellowship with an institution which we believe is not of God. And we should be remiss in our daty to ourselves and you, and chargeable/before the Mast High, if wo-did not speak on the subject in a monner not to be misunderstoud. We do most solennly believe, as we shall answer of the bar of God, where every secret work will be tried, that the introduction of Orange Societies into our Province should be regretted by every lover of good order : and peace; and we noted to you, brethren, if their evil consequences are not known from the perty spirit which have i have engendered—the rists which have followed—the bloud that has been shed—end, the unprepared souls which . have them deviced into eternity. O, brethren, is not their spirit opposed to his gospel who has soid, "if my kingdom were of this world, then would my servants fight" (John xviii: 36.) and is not their declared object the eccomplishment of that which God has declared shallke accomplished by very different menne. (2 Thes. ii: 8.)

When we look at the history of the Church of God, since the days of our Divine Lord, we find its tree spiritnelity has only been retained among those who have suffered for Jesus' sake; and the only true defence of his Church has been his truth. Hamon organizations to defend divine institutions have over subverted from the simplicity that is in Christ, and thus one fabric after another has been reared, confounding for a season Truth und Error, until they have destroyed what they were designed to sustain. This we bolieve to be the nature and character of Oronge societies; and the fellowship of any of car brethren with them is to us a source of sorrow and regret. While we thus eddress you, denr brethren, far bait from us to reproach yuu, or revile eny.others. Foithfulaess is a duty we owe to yon, and to the world, end we cannot discharge that duty without declaring our solemn convictions. It is evident to as that the system you seek to destroy was established, and has been, until the present, parpetuated by human power. In the institution of which we spenk the same means is employed to overthrow that system, end defend the trne household of faith. (Gal. vi: 10.) Whereas the Lord saith, Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the Lord of hosts. (Zuch. iv:: 6,) And again: I will not save them by bow, NOR BY SWORD, NOR BY BATTLE. hy horses, nor hy horsemen, but I will seve them, by the Lord their God. (Hos. i. 7.) We confess then, deer breihren, that inasmuch as nny of you have identified yourselves with Orange Societies, we ere wounded end pained. You must thereby have fellowship to a certain degree with some who oppose our holy religion, and utterly contemn that profession which we have solemnly and conscientiously witnessed before engels end men. We now ask you-

we entreat you as hrethren beloved to come out from among them end be ye separate; (2 Cor. vi, 7.) Teke heed to the admonition of the spostle; it is good to do nothing whereby thy brother stumbleth, (Rom. xiv, 21;) nor yet to pat a stumbling block or occasion to fall in thy brother's way; (verse 13.) We ask you then brethren in the spirit of the apostle, to suffer your cherity toward us to abound, that the unity of the spirit, in the bond of peece may be preserved As christiens we most possess the spirit of Jesus ; we must fellew his exemple, keeping in mind that he ceme not to destroy men's lives, but to save them; (Luke ix. 56.) Though we are celled upon to wor o good warfare, (1 Tim. i: 18) to fight the good fight of faith, (chap. vi: 12) yet we do not wer efter the flesh, for the weapons of our werfare ore not carnel, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holda; (Cor. x: 3, 4.) O then FIGHT ONLY under the ceptein of your salvation, (Heb. ii: 10,) relly round the standard of our Immennel; let your loios be girded about with truth; here on the breastplete of righteousness-your feet shod with the preparetion of the gospel of peace; take the shield of faith, and helmet of sulvetion, and let your sword be the swCRD OF THE SPIRIT, which is the Word of God. (Eph. vi: 14, 17.) With this yon will destroy more error, and establish more truth, than all the bloodshed of centuries, while to our Jeruselom will be extended prece like a river, end the glory of the Gentiles like a flowing stream. (Isaiah lxvi: 13.) In conclusion, brethren, earnessly desiring and labonring for your welfare, we commend you to God, and to the word of his grace, (Acts xx: 32,) and to him that is able to keep you from falliog, and to present yon fonttless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy. To the only wise God, our Seviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen. (Jude xxiv: 25.)
