CLERK OF SENATE TO RETIRE

A Native of the United States, He Fought in the Civil War.
OTTAWA, April 14.—(Special.)—Major Sam. E. St. Onge Chapeau, clerk of the senate and master in chancery, has been granted one year's leave of absence, after which he will be superannuated. He is a native of Syracuse, N.Y., where he was born in 1839. At the outbreak of the civil war in 1861 he joined the regular army, and rose to the rank of captain in the 16th Regiment of Infantry. He was appointed brevet of major for gallant services during the Atlanta campaign and at the battle of Jonesboro. He was also at the battle of Shiloh, Chickamauga and Chattanooga, and at the siege of Corinth. In 1888 he was in charge of the troops at Augusta, Ga., during the riots which took place between the whites and colored people on the occasion of the first election of President Cleveland. He was appointed to his present position in 1900.

FOUND BY FINGER PRINTS.

NEW YORK, April 14.—Finger prints of 200 workers in a novelty factory were affixed by detectives to-day for duplicate marks found upon the door and cash drawer of the safe, which was looted Wednesday night of \$688. Among the lot the detectives found one they say identical with the tell-tale imprints, and they arrested Joseph Roberts, a negro porter, who was locked up, charged with being implicated in the robbery. It took nearly two days to take the imprints and compare them.

PEACE AGAIN REIGNS IN CHAMPAGNE DISTRICTS

Authorities Hopeful That Rioting is Over—Women Rushed to Rescue of Arrested.
EPERNAY, April 14.—Peaceful conditions reign to-night in the department of Marne. The day was taken up with the trials of wine growers, who had been arrested during the disorders of several days past, and the summary jurisdiction courts here and at Rheims sentenced a number of persons charged with slight offences from one week to two months' imprisonment.
Two of the prime movers in Wednesday's riots here were arrested to-day. The authorities this morning are hopeful that the rioting is over. The vote of the chamber of deputies in nullifying the action of the senate with reference to the delimitation of the champagne districts, and the expressed intention of Premier Monro to refer the whole question to the council of state for settlement, served to a large extent, it is believed, in appeasing the excited troops at Angoulême, Ga., during the riots which took place between the whites and colored people on the occasion of the first election of President Cleveland.
