



THE FINANCIAL SITUATION. There is no apparent change in the local money market this week. The minimum rate still continues at 5½ per cent. on call, and even at this high rate funds are not very plentiful. The same state of things is reported at Montreal. In New York, however, the market has been firm throughout the week at 3½ to 4 per cent, while time loans on stocks are 4 to 4½ per cent. Owing to these high rates, a good deal of foreign capital has been 'ent on Wall-street the past few days, and the ex-ports of gold, which have been resumed, have been curtailed somewhat hy this foreign capital being employed on this side of the Atlantic. London is doing but little in American stocks, but the cheap money there has stimulated a demand for first-class British and colonial securities, which are quoted at the highest prices is a long time. 


