Spanish Flying Squadron Has Got Out of the Way.

CAPE VERDE FLEET TURNS UP AT CADIZ

Washington Officials are Speculating as to Whether the Spaniards May Not Send a Squadron After Dewey and Regain Their Hold On the Philippines-Don Carlos Owns Up That He Had a Desperate Scheme on Hand Before the War Broke Out-War News Is Scarce.

Notwithstanding the Manila reverse Spanish statesmen still talk of sustaining the honor of the nation. Senor Sagasta, the Prime Minister, deplores the hopeless situation and admits that Spain has been ruined by ternal troubles fomented by the adversaries of the Government. No attempt has been made to conceal the gravity of the situation in Spain; yet there is no whining for peace. The Government, on the contrary, is exhorting Spaniards to stand united in defence of their country. It has been proposed that the Cortes sit continuously till the war measures are adopted. There appears to be no definite plan of campaign, and the Cape Verde squadron has returned to

Apart from the war. Spain has serious troubles. Madrid is threatened with a famine and the food supplies of the city must be replenished or a revolt will break out. Captain-General Blanco has cabled for supplies to be sent to Cuba. Coal, ammunition and provisions are also wanted at Porto Rico and the Balearic and Canary Islands.

The Archbishops of the Catholic Church in the United States have agreed upon a letter to be sent to the clergy and laity, to be read in the pulpits next Sunday, enjoining loyalty to President McKinley and the Government in this crisis, and to pray for the success of the American arms.

Don Carlos, the Spanish pretender, admits having had in contemplation a desperate and hazardous enterprise, the aim of which was to force the hand of the present government, but the outbreak of war caused him to halt.
