**TOMMY CHURCH WOULD PUT CLAMPS ON ALIENS**

TORONTO, April 11.—Mayor Church will present a motion at the next council meeting asking the city to memorialize the Government to disfranchise all aliens in Canada not resident in the country for 25 years. He will also move a resolution to ask the Dominion Government to order munition manufacturers to discharge all alien enemies employed. In some cases aliens are in foreign positions. In one Toronto munition works 93 per cent are said to be aliens.

## CANADIANS FIGHT IN HAND-TO-HAND BATTLES ON VIMY

Canadian Gunners Show Up as of the Best.

CAN KEEP FOE MOVING

German Barbed Wire No Obstacle to Prepared Advance.

CANADIAN HEADQUARTERS IN FRANCE, via London, April 11.—(By Stewart Lyon, special correspondent, Canadian Press.)—The ground won in Monday's great battle gives evidence of the terrific effort of the artillery preparation to have been never before.

The German tactics in withdrawing from the line to their deep dugouts when the bombardment began, and leaving only their pattern of barbed wire, explained by the condition of the enemy's line, which is smashed almost beyond recognition at some points.

Our barrage and direct fire were so intense that the Germans sought to escape it by advancing.

Hand-to-Hand Fighting.

The number of their dead found well forward in the front lines in such positions as indicate hand-to-hand fighting, and the utter desolation of the enemy's position, which the enemy believed impregnable, must have had a most depressing effect on them.

**WANT FEDERAL LAW TO CHECK VENEREAL DISEASES**

TORONTO, April 11.—Z. A. Leach, K.C., is now engaged on a bill to amend the Criminal Code, which will be submitted in a few days to the federal government, to prevent the spread of venereal diseases.

The act would require registration of people suffering from specific diseases, doctors to be compelled to forward particulars to the health department, and where all reference would be made by number.

By another clause a sufferer would be compelled when his case was discovered in a hospital or other institution, to undergo treatment, and be on the same basis as a man suffering from any infectious disease.

**\$200,000 WORTH OF FOOD PRODUCTS LOST IN FIRE**

BELLEVILLE, April 11.—Fire broke out at half-past three this morning in the warehouse of the Canadian Food Products Company, Limited, and before it was under control eight hours later, the worst in the history of the state, on a disloyal employee, who is believed to have been the cause of the loss of 116 known dead, most of whom were girls and young women.

This amazing destruction, late today spurred on the investigations of the catastrophe already under way by the federal government, local officials and officers of the company. Numerous suspects were rounded up here in Belleville, and in London, Ontario, and in Camden, N.J., and in each case the disposition of the prisoners was left to the local authorities.

The arrests so far, however, have apparently furnished no tangible clue as to the perpetrator of the alleged plot.
