The manufacturers of condensed milk are at present making money fast and can afford to give the highest prices for milk. Mr. Hearns said that the cheese situation was such that he could not discuss it minutely at present. During the year of 1914 the entire production of cheese in Western On-tario amounted to 21,009,065 pounds and sold at an average price of 13 cents a pound. In 1916 the price of cheese in-creased substantially as did the pro-duction because of the large demand of the troops in training and overseas. The increase was about eight million pounds more and the cost advanced 5 cents per pound. This large increase in production will be lessened if the milk production is not extraordinarily heavy this year, because of the sudden popularity of condensed milks with the United States and the fighting

Tributes to the memory of brave London boys who have made the supreme sacrifice for King and country are common, but one of the most touching which has yet reached the city is that to Mrs. Charles Phillips. 169 High street, from Lieut. George Spencer of the 18th Battalion Lieut. Spencer was the platoon commander of the late Allen "Tim" Phillips, who enlisted with the 142nd Battalion and who was killed on August 21 last while serving with the famous 18th. The young soldier was a member of the local staff of the Royal Bank and a popular young worker of the Adelaide Street Baptist Church. He was 20 years of age.

Dear Mrs. Phillips,—I have a sad, but proud, task to tell you about the death of your gallant son. In my opinion the greatest heroes of this terrible war are the privates in the ranks, and the stretcher-bearers are higher than these. It is the highest test of a man's courage and faith to attend the wounded, when terrible shells are falling all around and well I remember your son doing this. He was at all times courteous and faithful and brave in doing his duty. He stuck to my side, and during the last attacks of this battalion upon the Hun line and ready to do any work upon which I might send him. I will not forget him binding up one of the men's wounds during one of Fritz's barrages on our front trench. I marveled at his wondrous courage at the time right in the middle of the trench. Shells were bursting all around.



To show you what I thought of him I will write what I had sent into headquarters the very night before your son was killed: "I have the honor to recommend the following for conspicuous service. With this recommendation I was trying to get your son awarded the Military Medal. So you see what I thought of him. 


