## WILL ASK COUNCIL FOR \$175,000 ISSUE FOR NEW SCHOOLS

Board of Education Trims Down \$20,000.

According to Secretary R. M. McElhin, the board of education will submit to the next meeting of No. 1 committee a requisition for \$175,000 instead of the \$195,000 originally asked. No. 1 committee at its last meeting approved an issue for \$145,000, but it was discovered that the council legally could not grant part of the requisition.

A. A. Langford, chairman of the commercial advisory committee, calls attention to the fact that the council school board and it will be necessary to provide money for this. The members of No. 1 committee did not take cognizance of this fact and they cut off the balance which it was estimated a site would cost.

This site is purchased for the commercial school the money will go towards reducing the debt on the Lord Roberts School.

**WESTMINSTER WON'T OBJECT TO SUNDAY SPRINGBANK CARS**  
If Legislature Approves, the Township Is Willing.

"Resolved that if the Ontario Government enacts such a measure, we, the councilmen of Westminster Township, will not oppose it, providing the old regulations are lived up to and a satisfactory car service is provided."

The resolution was passed by the Westminster Township Council at a meeting held Monday afternoon in the Municipal Hall, Lambton, when a committee from the Byron Sanatorium and two representatives met the council regarding the Sunday car service to Springbank. A lengthy discussion took place, and the vote which followed was 6 to 1 in favor of not opposing the proposal. A petition was placed before the councilmen with 381 names of those living at the sanatorium in favor of favorable action on the question.

**Veterans of 33rd Will Ask Release of Pte. Jas. Kane**  
Petition Circulated in Behalf of Man Serving 15-Year Term in Quebec.

A petition is being formulated to assist in securing the release of Pte. James Kane, an old 33rd member who was sentenced to Quebec for 15 years for the killing of a Greek, after the latter had hit him on the shoulder with a bottle. The 33rd Comrades Club at a meeting in the G. W. V. A. club rooms last night decided upon a 33rd Battalion believed that Kane had been sent out on parole to go overseas, but was not the case. He has already served three years of his sentence, and just recently his mother died.

At his trial the members and officers of the 33rd Battalion gave Kane a pay towards paying the best lawyer in Quebec. The military authorities provide for this, but the 33rd Comrades thought it best to get a first-class man. This lawyer was paid in the neighborhood of \$1,500, and put up a poor defence.

Peacock and J. W. Cunliffe is to interview the G. W. V. A. Band in regard to giving a band concert on the Sunday of April 27.

An April 22 card party will be staged in the G. W. V. A. clubrooms by the 33rd Comrades Club.

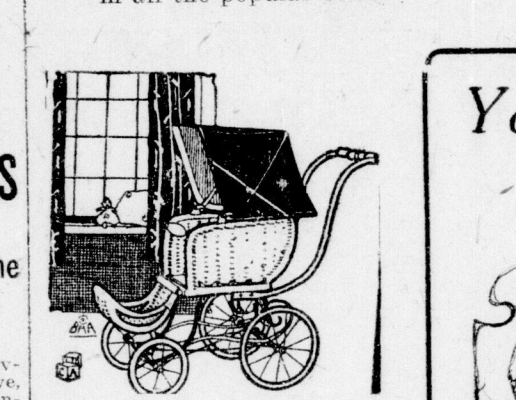

**CANADA'S AERIAL ROUTES PLANNED**  
In an article appearing in the Detroit Sunday News, the statement is made that the Canadian Government is now planning four main aerial highways in Canada. It is thought that the one known as the "Sunset Airway," extending from St. John, Nfld., across the continent to Prince Rupert, on the Pacific coast, will have a branch line from Toronto, passing through Central Ontario to connect with big American routes at Detroit, and will have a "station" here.

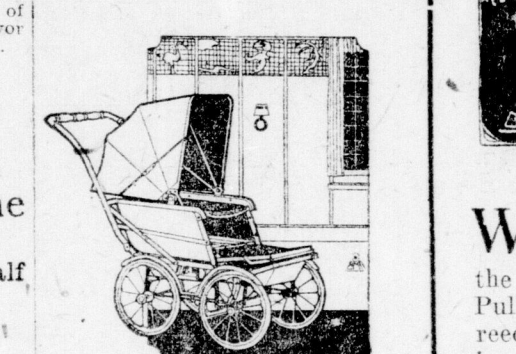
The Canadian Government is planning a series of mail and passenger air routes as follows:  
(1) The "All-Red" Aerial Highway, extending from St. John to Quebec, Montreal, Ottawa and straight west along the line of the Canadian Pacific Railroad to Port William and Winnipeg, Regina, Moose Jaw, Medicine Hat, Lethbridge, Calgary, through the Canadian National Parks, Revelstoke, Kamloops, Westminster and Vancouver and Victoria.  
(2) The Sunset Airway extending from St. John, Nfld., to Sydney, Halifax, St. John, N. B., Fredericton, Riviere du Loup, Quebec, Three Rivers, Montreal, Cornwall, Prescott, Brockville, Kingston, Belleville, Cobourg, Toronto, Camp Borden, Owen Sound, Sault Ste. Marie, Port Arthur, Winnipeg, Prince Albert, Saskatoon, Regina, Moose Jaw, Medicine Hat, Lethbridge, Calgary, through the Canadian National Parks, Revelstoke, Kamloops, Westminster and Vancouver and Victoria.  
(3) The Hudson Bay Trail extends from Winnipeg to Port Nelson, Hudson Bay.  
(4) The Dawson Trail extends from Victoria and Vancouver to Prince Rupert, Stewart and Dawson (via Juneau) by international agreement.  
From Toronto an extension of the Sunset Airway will run through Central Ontario and connect with the Chautau and Bell Airway at Detroit.

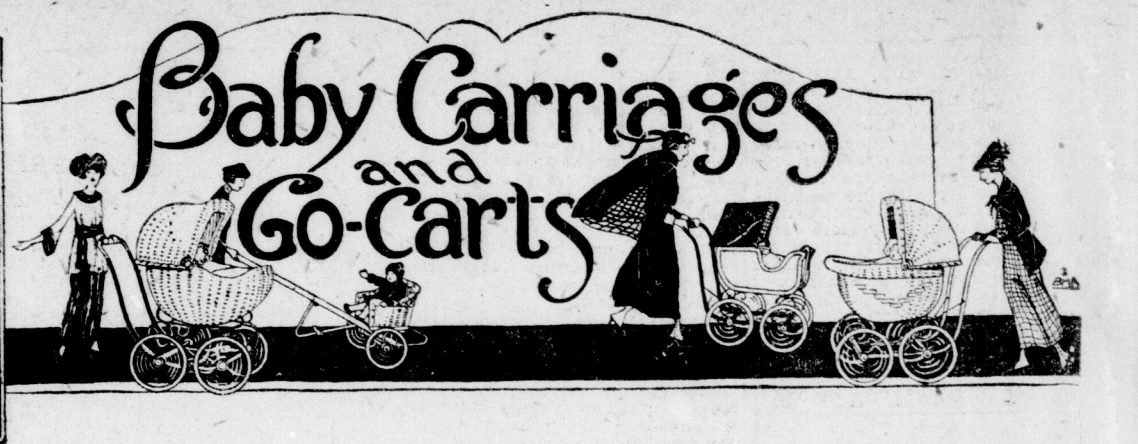
