THAW USED DOG WHIP ON GIRLS' BARE FLESH

Woman Testifies That White's Slayer Lured 200 Young Women to Lodging House.

WHITE PLAINS, N.Y., July 27.—Harry K. Thaw sat in the supreme court here to-day and heard a woman's testimony that made his pallid face flush as he saw a pearl-handled dog whip exhibited, and had seen him wield it on the bare flesh of young girls.

Two girls left the room. The witness was Miss Susan Merrill, a business girl, who had been a chapter in the life of Stanford White's life.

After the telling of Thaw's engaging story, the mysterious package was brought to court yesterday by Clifford W. Hatridge, Thaw's former counsel, and was opened and a pearl-handled whip about three feet long was introduced into view.

Under cross-examination by Charles Morchauer, counsel for Thaw, the witness was attacked fiercely. He succeeded in bringing out the fact that she had been recently arrested on a charge of perjury after an unsuccessful attempt to recover \$100,000 damages from a man.

A number of members of the Lederkrantz go to Olcott Beach to-night to the big barn dance to be held at the Olcott Beach Hotel.

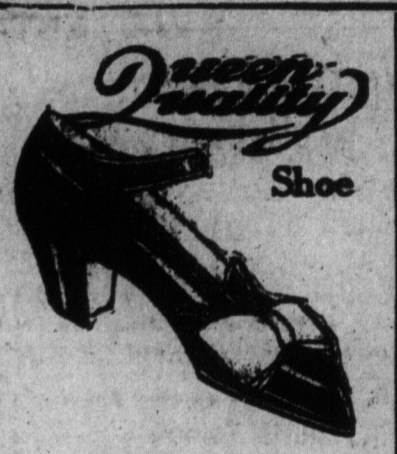

January Open Event. It is rumored that pressure will be brought to bear on W. K. McNaught, M.L.A., to present himself as mayoralty candidate next January.

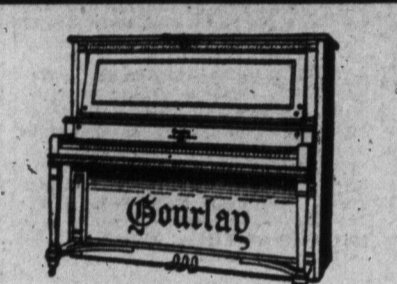

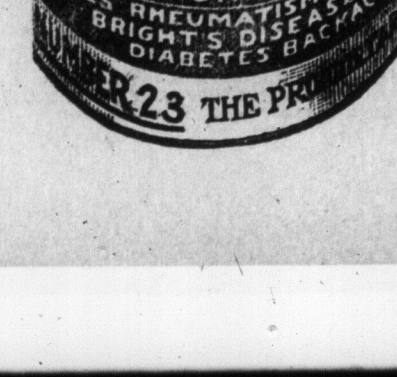
