Ottawa. Feb. 7.—(By Canadian Press).—The 1921 convention of the Great War Veterans' Association will be held in Port Arthur in the week commencing July 4. This was decided at the meeting of the Dominion execu-tive committee here today. One of the chief items on the agenda will be the uestion of amalgamation or co-opera-ion with other returned soldier organ-

A resolution urging the Dominion government to take steps to overcome the unfavorable rate of exchange on Canadian money in the United States was passed. Arrangements were made to exchange credentials with members of the American Legion. This, the executive believes, will redound to the benefit of veterans of both countries.
