MURDERED BABY'S BODY FOUND IN SNOW Remains of Victim in Upper Knoxford Case Discovered.

Inquest Will be Held This Afternoon and the Examination of the Prisoner Has Been Postponed for One Week.

UPPER KNOXFORD, N. B., Feb. 20 (Special)—Yesterday afternoon Deputy Sheriff Foster, aided by two of the neighbors, Lawrence and Wolberton, discovered the remains of the child for the murder of which Richard Grey is now in jail pending examination.

MULK IS IN NEW YORK His Nawabs Has Crossed the Continent and Will Sail for England Tomorrow.

NEW YORK, Feb. 19—After a flying trip across the American continent, making no stops except to change cars and gathering his only impressions of the country from a train window, His Highness Nawab Sultan ul Mulk Bahadur of Hyderabad, India, accompanied by a retinue of servants and two physicians, arrived in New York and was hurriedly taken to the White Star steamship Baltic, which sails tomorrow for England.
