Says Animals Do Not Need Sight For Direction Sense

We know that a lost cat is never really lost; that our dog will find his way home under most any conditions, and that it is wise sometimes, if we are confused, to let the horse guide himself. But the ability to find their way is still greater in undomesticated animals. Necessarily for self-reliance and the constant presence of danger keep their faculties and instincts on the keenest edge, writes L. E. Eubanks in "Our Dumb Animals."

The greatest factor in a many study of his location is sight, and without it he has but a vague sense of direction. But I knew a blind dog to find his way home over miles of unfamiliar country. Blind horses or cows go where they want to in a pasture, and you can't seriously "sidetrack" a cat by blind-folding it. Some animals seem being lost when sight is handicapped, but the reason usually is excitement—a panic of fear. Given time to deliberate their sense of direction saves them as a rule.

Naturalists once thought that ants returned to their home through the forests of grassblades, weed, sticks, etc., by scent, following their own track back. As a matter of fact an ant seldom goes back over the outbound trail, and there is considerable evidence that it relies more on the mysterious general sense of direction than on sight or any other particular sense.

One ant, as an experiment, was transported on a leaf beyond her destination, and when put down kept on in the same direction, though she was now going away from home. The general sense of direction is very remarkable in one species of the Australian ant; they build their nests along a north and south line so accurately that a traveler may direct his course by their trail. Snails have no sense of sight, or at least a very rudimentary one, yet it is not easy to lose a snail. And there's the turtle. It must be guided by the general sense, because

MOUNTIES FAIL TO LOCATE NUTTING

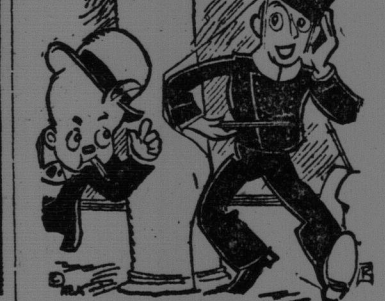
No Trace of Expedition Found in Baffin Land or Greenland.

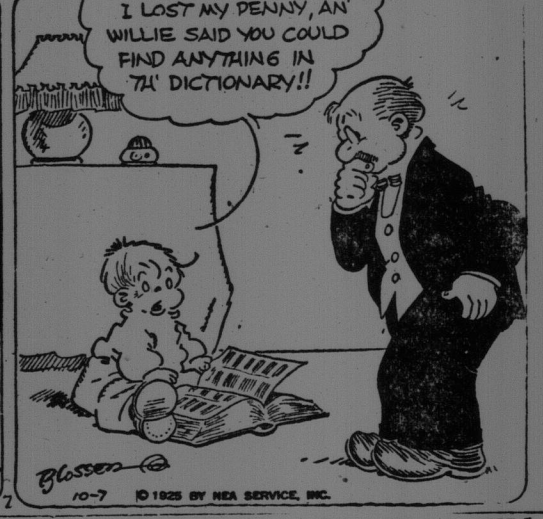

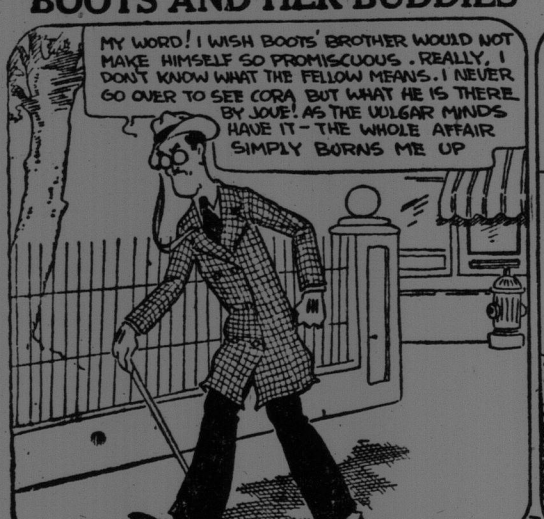

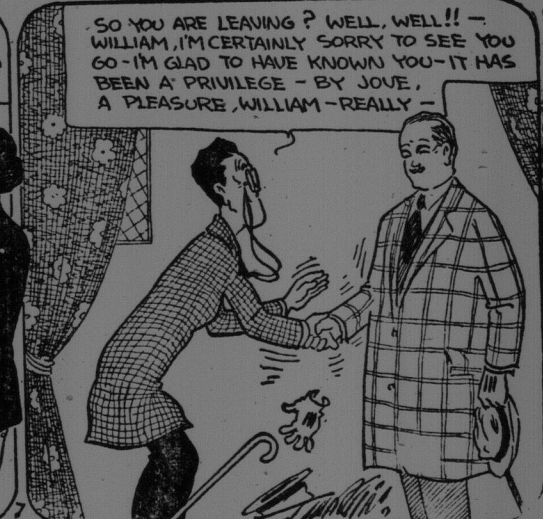
