

TATUE TO MARK GRAVE OF OYCE KILMER, POET SOLDIER

New York, Feb. 3.—A monument thirty-five feet in height is to mark the grave of Sergeant Joyce Kilmer, poet soldier, who died fighting in France with the Sixty-ninth Infantry. Sergeant Kilmer was the son of Dr. and Mrs. F. B. Kilmer of College avenue, New Brunswick, N. J., and the monument is to be put in place next summer when they go abroad to visit the French cemetery where he rests.

The memorial is the work of Paola Abbate, famous Italian sculptor, who, like Sergeant Kilmer, held membership in the Dante Society of America. The statue is called "David the Soldier."

Holds This View in Alfred G. Wanderbilt's Insurance Case-Policy is Declared

Albany, F.b. 3,-The sinking of the

So far as available records showed last night, the court of Appenis decision in the Alfred G. Vanderblit estate case is the first in which the sinking of the Lustania is held to have been an act of war. The policy involved was one in the Travelers Insurance Company for \$250,000. The company refused to pay on the ground that the policy was void in case death was directly or indirectly due to the war or to exposure to unnecessary danger and the executors brought suit.

On behalf of some of the 120 Americans who lost their lives when the vessel was sunk by a German submarine sel was sunk by a German submarine on May 7, 1915, suits aggregating \$6,000,000 were filed against the Cunard line, which owned the Lusitania. was an act of piracy. It also held the destruction of the passenger ship to have been "inexpressibly cowardly" and a violation of all laws governing civilized warfare at sea.

In a final decree Judge Mayer, sitting in the Admiralty Branch of the District Court nearly a year later, threw out all claims against the Cunard Line, still holding that the sinking was a German crime. His recommendation was that the sufferers of their heirs seek redress from the German Government through their State Department.

A decision of the Appellate Division in July, 1916, awarded \$40,000 insurance to the widow of Albert L. Hopkins had signed a "rider" to his policy releasing the insurer in the event that his death should result from the European war. That decision, however, was based on technical grounds—the failure of the company to have the rider properly filed and approval by State insurance authority.
