LEGAL OPINION TO BE SECURED

Trustees to Ask Atorney-General For Decision On Reading of Act.

The question of whether the expenditures for vocational education are for the keeping of the records since ditures for vocational education are to be covered by the general assessment for schools or are to be provided through separate assessment was considered at the meeting of the Board of School Trustees last night and it was decided to ask the ruling of the Attorney-General as the wording of the Vocational Education Act is vague.

Replying to a query, the chief super-intendent of education, Dr. W. S. Car-ter, wrote he understood any assess-ment for vocational education was apart from the assessments for schools and was not limited nor need it come within the \$401,000 which was authorrich for school assessment. It was decided to ask the Attorney-General to give his interpretation of the wording of the Act which is not clear, and it was pointed out that if vocational assessment must come within the school assessment it will be necessary to have the Legislature authorize a higher assessment this year.


Secretary's Report.






