

TENTH WITNESS FOR
THE PROSECUTION.

Mrs. Dorothy Blanche Hall, Walnut Cottage, Friday Street, Warnham, Sussex. Having been duly sworn states:-

I am Mrs. Dorothy Blanche Hall, Walnut Cottage, Friday Street, Warnham Sussex. I first met "Lofty", a Canadian Soldier, through my husband who is in the R.A.F. The accused whom I now recognize B-88714 Campbell, F., was known to me as "Lofty". My husband brought him home and he has been visiting me and my family ever since. He has brought some food-stuffs to my house, first tin of marmalade and a tin of luncheon meat. He also brought me a pound margarine, a pound of butter, three tins of sardines, a tin of herrings, about a quarter of a pound of tea and some loose biscuits. That is all he has ever brought me and he said he got the stuff from one of the cooks.
