BY-LAWS. At a meeting of the Council of the Municipality of the County of Northumberland, held at the Council Chamber, Newcastle, on Tuesday, the eighteenth day of January, A. D. 1881.

Resolved. That the following By-Laws be made and established for the government of the said Municipality.

A BY-LAW Relating to Dogs. Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the County of Northumberland:

1. That a tax of \$1.00 shall be imposed on the owner, keeper, or harbinger of each and every dog, within the limits of the front lots, in the Lower District of the Parish of Chatham.

A BY-LAW Relating to the going at large of Cattle. Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the County of Northumberland:

1. That Section 4 of the By-Laws relating to the going at large of cattle and fowl passed at April Sittings 1876, so far as the same relates to the Parish of Chatham, be repealed and in lieu thereof, that no ox, cow, or heifer, shall be suffered or allowed to go or be at large at any time of the year, in that part of the said Parish, lying between the old Napan road and the street or road leading past the St. John's Church Burying Ground, and extending back to Howard Street (so called) leading past Walker's; thence in direct lines, to the said roads or streets in the said Parish of Chatham.

2. That no cattle be allowed to run or go at large on the shore, between the mouth of Fairley's Mill Stream, and the lower line of the farm of John Gillespie, on the North side of the South-west, in the Parish of Blackville, at any time from the tenth day of May until the fifteenth day of October, in each year.

3. All the penalties imposed by "A By-Law relating to the going at large of cattle and fowl," passed at April Sittings 1876, so far as applicable, shall apply to Sections 4 and 5 of the By-Laws, hereinafter, may be demanded and recovered by the Hodgees, Constables and Poundkeepers, respectively, for performing their several duties.

A BY-LAW Relating to Booms and Booming. Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the County of Northumberland:

1. That the Boom Master of Barclay River Boom shall, on or before the 31st day of December in each and every year, render to a Committee of three persons appointed by the shareholders of said Boom, a detailed statement of all lumber that shall pass through the said Boom during the season, together with the amount of boomage collected thereon.

2. That the Boom Master shall be entitled to receive out of the amount collected, the sum of \$1.00 per day for each day's actual attendance at said Boom, and the balance of the boomage collected shall be distributed by said Committee among the shareholders in proportion to the quantity of lumber each may have.

3. All By-Laws heretofore made repugnant to or inconsistent with the foregoing provisions are hereby repealed.

Miramichi Advance. CHATHAM, N. B., MARCH 10, 1881. The Government and the Legislative Council.

The Local Legislatures having to deal with municipal and general questions, will be able to dispose of the same more expeditiously than the Provincial Legislature.

As the work of the Provincial Legislature since the Union was very largely devoted on the Parliament of Canada, and the local Legislatures have to deal with municipal and general questions, the Executive of New Brunswick should have been reduced in number, the Legislative Council abolished, and the business disposed of as expeditiously as possible.

As the great Province of Ontario, with a population over a million and three quarters and a revenue of nearly \$2,000,000, has no Executive of any kind, and no Upper House, New Brunswick cannot require an Executive of nine and a Legislative Council of twenty.

The "St. John Globe" assigns a reason why no reduction has been made, viz: "The politicians are not disposed to reduce the offices, inasmuch as they live off of them."

If the session closes without any change in the face of the declaration of Sir Alexander Gait, and the experience of Ontario with an Executive of nine, the conditions of New Brunswick will accept the reason assigned by the "Globe."

When the Hon. Mr. Mackenzie and farmer reduce the work of their establishments, they lose no time in curtailing their staff. As the Legislature has now no duty to deal with municipal questions, "the expense should be infinitely less" than before the Union.

SECTIONAL VIEW. Some defend an Executive of nine on sectional grounds. In the Western Provinces with an area greater than New Brunswick, no such office is heard, the best men of the party are assumed to be taken irrespective of locality.

While eight counties of New Brunswick are unrepresented in the Government, the city of St. John and Westmorland have each a portfolio and each with a "candidate," and this while the Legislature the old border county, with its agricultural, fishing, lumbering, mining, shipping and mercantile interests, and with 1878 portfolio taken from her, showing that in sectional equity the Government is not fair.
