LOOK TO YOUR LIGHTS
Forty-one vehicles on the highway at night without any light of any kind — be they horse-drawn or not — is too many. But that is what one motorist counted on a night drive from Three Rivers to Montreal Thanksgiving Day. He reported to George A. McNamee, manager of the Royal Automobile Club of Canada. The Club is again asking the Quebec Government to pass a law making it compulsory for all vehicles using the public highways to carry a light at night, and it will press the demand until it meets with success. At the same time, it urges all motorists to make sure that their head and tail lights are in good order. Sound advice: Fog, rain and early darkness make driving particularly hazardous at this time of the year.
