GOMPERS DEFEND EIGHT HOUR DAY TO WORLD LABOR

Tells International Conference it is Best Production is Beaten on Vote.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 7.—Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, threw down the gauntlet in the International Labor Conference today. One was ed up and he was badly beaten in a hard fought skirmish over the hour day or forty-eight hour w to be decided.

His motion to have the eight day referred to a special com with all the proposals in hand defeated by a vote of forty-three to thirty. The resolution of Mr. Barnes, M. P., adopting the convention of the organizing co too as the basis of discussion. Mr. Gompers declared, prac excluded the consideration of the hour day was carried fifty-five to one.
