But it is about 280 statute miles east of here, and 330 miles north and south. It is a very large area, and I have surveyed, nor anything like fully explored. No doubt a large part of it is not arable, but I think that at least 40 per cent is not less than 40 per cent of it is good arable. The best hard wheat sown at St. Louis was grown at Vermillion, on the 116 degrees west. That is about 340 statute miles north, and 100 west of Eads, and is about 100 statute miles north of 92 or 92 1/2 miles north of the international boundary. At Vermillion the Hudson Bay Company has farming mills.

Now, I have written in the diary of James Hodd, an experienced English gunner of Winnipeg, who had no good reason for his business, nor his family. The evidence in it is, therefore, absolutely to be trusted. He traveled to Athabasca in 1878, and he was there for a year, then up the Athabasca, about 120 miles as the crow flies, to the "rocked end" freight boat, to the west end of Lesser Slave Lake, and he was there for eighteen days, going west beyond the Smoky River to a point about long 110

for long ignoring the Canadian West.
