New York, Aug. 1-Information has been received here that the govern-ment of the Province of Quebec has prohibited the exportation of pulp-wood from lands held by settlers on ticket. Where full payment for lands has been made and ownership passes to the buyer the prohibition does not

apply.

The action of the Quebec authorities is said to be the second step in their movement to prohibit the exportation of pulpwood which is used largely in the United States for the manufacture of printing paper. A previous pro-hibition had been placed on the expor-tation of wood cut from crown lands. Together the crown lands and settlers' lands have heretofore furnished about 47 per cent of the pulpwood brought from Canada to the United States.
