

NOVA SCOTIA UNIT PREPARE TO FIGHT

Ottawa, April 27—In the early casualty list last night, which carries forty-six names, no less than sixteen are men from the maritime provinces, indicating that battalions from those provinces suffered heavily in the recent fighting.

Of the sixteen maritime men three from New Brunswick are mentioned, all being reported "wounded," as follows: William A. Davis, 38 Dufferin Row, St. John (N. B.); William J. Grant, 17 St. Andrews street, St. John (N. B.); and Douglas Murray, of St. Stephen (N. B.).
