From the Red Bank Indian village, and there is immense quantities of firewood on it, and it is too far distant to be of much use to the Indians, so if the Department thinks this advisable, I would recommend it. I can safely say that those Indians would much rather not have the opertunity of earning anything, if they will be supported by the Department, and this is one of the reasons for Tenass being opposed to cutting far sale on the reserve.

In further reference to fuel for the teachers residence I beg to say that I cannot recall where it was ever supplied from the Red Bank Reserve.
