

the President thereof. The evidence shall be taken down in writing, and the decision of the majority of the members shall be the decision of the Court as to whether the charge be proved or not; and, if proved, the penalty to which the accused shall be subjected, such sentence being subject to the approval of the Commanding Officer.

**Article XI.—On non-payment of Subscription.**

If any member fail to pay up his subscription after being duly notified so to do, the Commanding Officer may, within seven days after such notice, order the member's name to be erased from the Roll, and he shall not again be acknowledged as a member of the Corps unless re-elected.

**Article XII. On non-payment of Fines.**

Any member of the Corps who shall refuse to pay any fine imposed on him under these regulations shall be dismissed.

**Article XIII. Acts of Insubordination.**

Any member of the Corps who shall be guilty of any act of insubordination or disgraceful conduct, while in uniform or during any muster or assembly whatsoever, shall, on conviction by a Court of Enquiry, be liable to be dismissed the Corps, or to suffer such punishment as the Court may have power to award.

**Article XIV. Disobedience of Orders.**

Any member refusing to obey the lawful order of any one his superior in rank in the Corps shall be dismissed.

**Article XV. Complaints.**

All complaints by members must be made in writing to the Commanding Officer.
