KINNEY, JOSEPH ROBBINS. (Yarmouth.)

Descended from a New England family who came to this country early in the present century. B. at Annapolis, N.S., 1839. M. at Yarmouth, in 1860, Ada E., dau, of Andrew Ritchie, of Annapolis (she d. 1878.) Is Consular Agent for the U.S. A Notary Public. Believes that the country would be better governed if the Local Governments were abolished, and, also, that the general Government should own all railroads and telegraph lines.
