## GEORGII III. REGIS.

## C A P. LXII.

An Act to permit Rum and other Spirits, the Produce of the British Colonies in the West Indies, to be imported into Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, and the Islands of Cape Breton, Prince Edward, and Newfoundland, from the Island of Bermuda.

[10th June 1811.]

HEREAS it is expedient to extend to the Provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, the Island of Cape Breton, Prince Edward's Island, and the Island of Newfoundland, the Provisions of an Act passed in the Forty-ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, intituled, An Act to allow the Importation of Rum and other 49 G.3. c. 16, Spirits from the Island of Bermuda into the Province of Lower Canada without Payment of Duty, on the same Terms and Conditions as such Importation may be made directly from His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in the West Indies; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That, from and after the passing of this Act, any Rum or other Rum may be Spirits being the Produce or Manufacture of any of His Majesty's Sugar exported from Colonies in the West Indies, legally and directly imported into the Island Bermuda into of Bermuda from His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in the West Indies, may be of Nova exported from thence into the Provinces of Neva Scotia and New Brunf- Scotia, &c.
