

It is entirely agreeable to this Government that the report and the notes from the Secretary of State attached thereto, namely his note of February 3, 1923, to the Ambassador, and his note of August 21, 1923, to the Chargé d'Affaires ad interim, be released for simultaneous publication in the United States and Canada at an early date. If it be agreeable to the Canadian Government that the report of the Board and the report of the Committee of the Privy Council for Canada (P.C. 1288), approved July 10, 1923, attached thereto, be made public, it would be agreeable to this Government that the report of the Board and the several papers annexed thereto be given publicity in the United States and Canada at a date and hour which may be designated by the Dominion Government.

If the Canadian Government designate the date and hour for publication, I should be grateful if I might be informed of them shortly in advance in order that there may be time for taking the preliminaries necessary to the release in the United States.
