

Right Rev. Sir,

Referring to previous correspondence had relative to medical attendance on behalf of Indians of Lake Reserve, I beg to say that the Department is now making arrangements by which Mrs. Shaw, the field matron, will have to call Dr. Chisholm, of Prince Albert, to the Reserve in emergency cases only. With respect to cases, which in my opinion, should receive treatment at the hospital but not of an urgent nature, I may say that she will be asked to make report thereon to the Department through Mr. G. Indian Agent, Sask. I may further inform Your Lordship that a report has been received from Dr. Chisholm with respect to the case of Mrs. Charley. Seemingly this woman is suffering from tuberculosis in an advanced form, and therefore it is considered not to place her in a hospital, as in all probability she would receive but little benefit from treatment in that direction.
