

UKRAINIAN SELF-TAUGHT.

The Alphabet with English Equivalents and Phonetic Pronunciation.

The Ukrainian Alphabet has 33 letters:—

Ukrainian Printed Characters.	English Equivalents.	Name and Phonetic Pronunciation
A, a.	a, o.	(ah) when accented , like ah as a in father, as брат (braht) Brother. When unaccented it is short, as a in about.
B, b.	b, p.	(beh) as b in both, except when followed by a hard consonant, when it is sounded p as гу́пка (hoopka), a sponge.
V, v.	v, w.	(veh) like v in vile, except before the hard consonants and at the end of words, when it sounds like w, as лав-ка (lah'wka) the bench, пішов (pee-shoh'w) gone.
F, f.	f.	(hah) like h in have, as рак (hahk) the hook.
G, g.	g.	(gheh) as g in get, as газда (gazdah')....
D, d.	d, t.	(deh) like d except at the end of words and before the hard consonants, when it is sounded like t, as гадка (bah'tka) a thought; рад (rat) glad. Before the soft vowels (е, і, ю, я, ѹ, Ѽ) and the minute soft sign (ь) it softens and will be denoted by d.
E, e.	e.	(eh) as e in bet, as nec (pehs) the dog.
