AT the beginning of Morning Prayer the Minister shall read with a loud voice some one or more of these Sentences of the Scriptures that follow. And then he shall say that which is written after the said Sentences.

WHEN the wicked man turneth away from his wickedness that he hath committed, and doeth that which is iawful and right, he shall save his soui aive. Ezek. 18. 27.

I acknowledge my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. *Psalm* 51. 3.

Hide thy face from my sins, and biot out ali mine iniquities. Psalm 51. 9.

The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt

not despise. Psalm 51. 17.

Rend your heart, and not your garments, and turn unto the Lord your God: for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness, and repenteth him of the evil. *Joel* 2. 13.

To the Lord our God beiong mercies and forgivenesses, though we have rebeiied against him: neither have we obeyed the voice of the Lord our God, to walk in his iaws which he set before us. Dan. 9. 9, 10.
