## THE JEWS OF RUSSIA

REASON FOR THE MOUJIK'S DISLIKE OF THE HEBREW.

Underlying Causes of Race Riots in the Czar's Dominions-The Jew's Aversion to Farm Labor-Oppression by Law-With Few Exceptions Jews Are Con fined to Western Provinces of Russia

The recent massacre of Jews in the city of Kishineff, Province of Bessa-rabia, Russia, which has horrified the civilized world, naturally excites public interest as to the reason for the hatred in which the Jews are held by the Christian population of the Czar's dominions.

According to the law, Jews can reside only in the thirteen western provinces of Russia, with the exception

tion that professional Jews, mechanics and others pursuing an industrial occupation are free to reside in any

part of the country.

Jews had settled at an early date in different parts of Russia, but the great influx came when in 1772, 1793 and 1795 certain portions of th kingdom of Poland were added to the



TYPICAL RUSSIAN JEWS. Empire. The Jews had found a home


in Poland when driven out of other European states, and had lived there in comparative peace; but as part of Poland Russia always looked upon them as aliens, and from a religious standpoint as heretics. Had they been permitted to circulate freely in the Empire the few millions would soon have been lost in the larger population; but out of her Polish possessions Russia made one huge ghetto, and surrounded the settlements of Jews in other parts with so many difficulties as to make exit

therefrom practically impossible.
This resulted in making the Jewish population of many of the towns
and cities predominate, and when the so-called German anti-Semitism crossed the border the riots of 1881 took place. General Ignatieff, who was Minister of the Interior, used these occurrences as an excuse for these occurrences as an excuse for promulgating the May laws (May 3, 1882, old style). They created a ghetto within a ghetto—or pale, as it is now called.

The May laws, it is true, were

merely temporary, but they might be prolonged indefinitely. Some of the laws are framed, in ambiguous lan-guage so as to allow great latitude in their interpretation, and every year this interpretation has become more rigid and forced. Whole families have been expelled from villages almost without a moment's notice in the dead of winter and at night. Legislation has been particularly hard upon skilled artisans. They had free transit outside the pale by Alexander II. in 1865. The new idea is to force them back again into the

pale by every possible measure.
One of the causes of the Russian
moujik's dislike of the Jew is the
latter's disinclination for farm labor. The vast majority of the Russians are agriculturists, and they

feel that the Jew, too, should eat his bread in the sweat of his brow. But every Jew wants to be a middleman and not a farmer. The Jew will not

and not a farmer. The Jew will not plow; still he is not averse to landed property. In Bessarabia in 1865 the Jews owned 65,000 acres, and now they own much more.

In short in the provinces of new Russia the Jews own a couple of million acres and rent as much more from the Crown. All these lands are cultivated by Christian hands under Jewish supervision. With conditions as they are now, further anti-Jewish riots are likely to occur at any time.
