An engroffed Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act for the more easy discovery, and effectual punishment, of buyers and receivers of stolen goods and monies, in cases of perty larceny, and in other cases," was, according to order, read a second time.

On motion of Mr. Papineau, senior, seconded by Mr. Viger;

Resolved, that the faid Bill be committed to a Committee of the whole House.

RESOLVED, that this House will, on Friday next, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the said Bill.

The order of the day, for the House to resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the engrossed Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act further to continue, for a limited time, and amend, an Act passed in the forty-third year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for the better preservation of His Majesty's Go-" vernment, as by law happily established in this Province;" being read;

The House resolved itself into the said Committee.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. Louis Roi took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair;

And Mr. Louis Roi reported, that the Committee had gone through the Bill, without making any amendment thereto.

On motion of Mr. Mure, seconded by Mr. Caldwell;

RESOLVED, that the said Bill be now read for the third time.

And the faid Bill was accordingly read for the third time.
