Friday, 14th March, 1800.

THE House according to order, proceeded to take into confideration the motion made by Mr. *Planté* on Wednesday last, "That this "House do now resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, "to confider of the most proper means of obtaining information con-"cerning the rights and pretentions which this Province may have upon "the College of *Quebec*, and the Estates thereunto annexed."

And the Houfe being moved that His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor's Meffage of Wednefday last, relative to the faid object, might be read—the fame was read accordingly.

After some debate thereon, the question was put upon the motion, the House divided, and the names were taken down as follow, viz.

RESOLVED, That this House, do now refolve itself into a Committee of the whole House to confider of the most proper means of obtaining information concerning the rights and pretensions which this Province may have upon the College of Quebec, and the Estates thereunto annexed:

Accordingly the House resolved itself into the faid Committee. Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Dr. Fisher took the Chair of the Committee;

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair,

And Dr. Fisher reported, that the Committee had made some progress, and had directed him to move for leave to fit again to-morrow.

And the queftion being put, that the Committee have leave to fit again? The Houle divided,

Yeas 21 Nays 6

And the fame being carried by a majority of fifteen.
