PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor Major-General

Charles Hastings Doyle,

[L. S.] HASTINGS DOYLE. Administrator of the Government, and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia, and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Writs issued for the General Election of Members to serve in General Assembly, bearing teste on the first day of May last, the respective Sheriffs of the several Counties in this Province were commanded to summon the persons who should be elected and chosen according to exigency of said writs, to attend Her Majesty's Service in General Assembly, at such time and place as should be notified by Proclamation for that purpose:

I do accordingly, by this Proclamation, give notice that I have appointed, and do hereby appoint, THUESDAY, the Fourth day of FEBRUARY next, at Halifax, for the meeting of the said General Assembly, for the Despatch of Business. And I hereby require the Members of the Legislative Council and the House of Assembly to attend in General Assembly on the said day, at Halifax: whereof they, and all others concerned, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
