A Message from His Majesty's Council.

Mr. Bliss, Master in Chancery, informed the House that the Council had agreed to the Resolutions of Appropriation, dated 28th January, excepting that granting 3*l.* to the Commissioner appointed to administer oaths to the Members to serve in General Assembly, which is not agreed to : The Commissioner having been paid for that service upon the first meeting of the present House, beg leave to decline receiving any further remuneration.

Read the engrossed Address of the House to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, upon his departure from the Province.

Ordered, that Mr. M'Kay, Mr. Ketchum and Mr. Miles, be a Committee to wait on His Excellency to know when he will be pleased to receive the Address.

Read, as engrossed, the Resolutions of Appropriation, of the 3d inst.

Ordered, that Mr. Dow take the said Resolutions to the Council and desire their concurrence thereto.

Read a third time, as engrossed,

A Bill to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue to the payment of the Ordinary Services of the Province.

Resolved, that the Bill do pass.

Ordered, that Mr. Weldon take the said Bill to the Council, and desire their concurrence thereto.

Mr. Taylor, pursuant to leave, brought in a Bill to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue for the services therein mentioned.

Which was read a first and second times.

And on motion of Mr. Taylor, the House went into Committee of the whole, in consideration of the said Bill.

Mr. Humbert in the Chair of the Committee.

The Chairman reported, they had made progress therein, and that he was directed to ask leave to sit again.

Ordered, that the Report be accepted, and leave granted.

Mr. Taylor, from the Standing Committee appointed to examine and report upon Public and Private Accounts, and to whom was referred, by a Resolution of yesterday, the accounts of Robert Doak, Supervisor of the Great Road from Fredericton to Newcastle, made the following report ; which he read,

That having had under consideration the said Accounts, as well as the Provincial Auditor's Report and Audit thereon, the Committee find that the Audit embraces tools, camp equipage, work of Oxen, hay, pasturage, &c., as part of the charge for provisions. The provisions, including expense of Scow hire and hauling the same, amounting to 353*l.* : 5 : 4, which is a fraction more than 2*s.* 2*½d.* per diem for each working day.
