And a further Sum of Fifty Five Pounds Eleven Shillings and One Penny Farthing to Elizabeth Amelia Belcher, for her Pension agreeable to the former Resolution of the Governor, Council and Assembly. further Sum of Twenty Pounds to Benjamin Belcher, for compleating the Road from Cornwallis to Aylesford. And a further Sum of Two Hundred Pounds to the Justices in their Sessions for the County of Shelburne, to enable them to Discharge the very heavy Debt which the County has incurred in erecting Public Buildings and performingothery necessary Services.
