Attachment of the G. W. R. Property at Detroit—Security in a Suit for \$634,000--A Car Loan Company the Plaintiffs.

Detroit, Mich., Aug. 10.—The property of the Great Western Railway Company in this city, including all the rolling stock and the large railroad ferry Michigan, was seized to-day on writs of attachment, as security in a suit began in behalf of the Erie and Chicago Car Loan Company.
