ARE DOING WELL

Brantford Soldiers in Barracks at Toronto Having a Good Time.

News from Brantford lads at Toronto is to the effect that they are having a great old time, although the commissariat fell down the first day from Toronto as follows:

A rigid medical inspection is in progress under Col. J. T. Fotheringham, A.D.M.S., and will be completed to-night. Up to the present the number of rejections has not exceeded ten percent in any quota, and in some cases is considerably less, a percentage which is regarded as satisfactory. Guy Young a member of the 51st Soo Rifles, who was ill on arrival at camp, was found to be suffering from pneumonia, and has been removed to the Western Hospital. This is the only case of illness reported.

The selection of officers for the Field Ambulance brigade, is in progress and is being based strictly on seniority.

Quotas for the mounted infantry will be drawn from the G. G. B. G. to the 2nd Dragoons, St. Catharines, and the 25th Brant Dragoons, Brantford, in equal proportions of 125 each. Col. C. V. Charwick of the 6th Mississauga Horse will be in command, and it is understood that the 2nd Dragoons will be under Lieut.-Col. Sandford F. Smith of the G. G. B. G. will be second in command. Recruiting is to begin at once. Artillery officers will be Lieut.-Col. Renette of Hamilton and Major J. O. Merritt of St. Catharines.

Lieut. John Hamilton Elliot of the King's 3rd Hussars, recommended for a Victoria Cross, a son of Lieut.-Colonel C. A. Elliot of Ottawa, was fatally wounded at the front.

FATEFUL KISSES AND WAR

The Gordon Highlanders Met Disaster After Historic Recruiting

In the year 1794 the beautiful, charming and famous Duchess of Gordon founded and raised the Gordon Highlanders, one of the most notable regiments of Scottish Highlanders. The most attractive recruit a new recruit in this gallant regiment was a guinea in gold and a kiss from the lips of the far-famed Duchess.

This seems all very good, yet the Gordon Highlanders paid dearly for the kiss they had received from the charming Duchess of Gordon. They were soon sent to fight the French in their first engagement 300 of them fell, killed and wounded.
