Ap plicant must appear in person at the Do ninion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for minon Landa Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Landa Agency (but me' Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and caltivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within sine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader by good standing may pre-empt a functor

certon alongside his nomestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six mouths residence in each extere verse after earning homestead pat ent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Precupition patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on extain conditions.
