**JOSEPHSBURG FARMERS  
GRIEVANCE.**

Mr. H. Hassard has handed us full  
copies of a series of resolutions passed at  
the indignation meeting of the Josephs-  
burg farmers re the recent dipping  
transactions accompanied by the fol-  
lowing letter:—

Medicine Hat, Dec. 20, 1905.  
Editor Medicine Hat Times.

Dear Sir:—Some time ago I handed  
for publication to some other papers a  
copy of the accompanying resolutions  
and letters, but for some reason not  
known to themselves they have failed  
to publish them.

As there are various theories as to  
the true nature and intent taken by  
the people in this matter, I feel that an  
injustice would be done in withholding  
it from the public.

As chairman of the people's committee  
and author of some of the matter, I have  
the honor of submitting same for publi-  
cation in your valuable paper.

We cannot possibly publish all the  
resolutions, but the following is a  
summary of each.

No. 1. Calls for a clean and impartial  
discharge of duties by public servants.

No. 2. As farmers were lead to believe  
about election time that they were a  
factor in the growth and development of  
the country, they claimed to have their  
interests consulted.

No. 3. That they have little in com-  
mon with the ranchers; that they have  
but few cattle, which are under constant  
care and observation, and free from con-  
tagious diseases; that their condition  
was not taken into consideration in the  
dipping orders.

No. 4. Calls for abrogation of the dip-  
ping order except in cases of live, man-  
gry, or other infectious and contagious dis-  
eases verified by competent authority.

No. 5. Charges the dipping inspector  
with exceeding his duty when he arrested  
the cattle of Chris. Kane and John  
Foster, senior, 64 head in all, including,  
as alleged, several milk cows, on their  
way home from Peter Hotick's dipping  
vat where they had been dipped. Kane's  
for the second time at a cost of \$10, and  
took them to James Robinson's dipping  
vat where they were again dipped.  
Kane's for the third time and Foster's  
for the second time, and left them in  
custody for 13 days and again dipped  
Kane's for the fourth time and Foster's  
for the third time at a cost of \$120, to-  
gether with the loss of milk and butter  
for the time they were detained on a  
too closely cropped pasture.

No. 6. Names a person alleged to be the  
prime mover in a suit described as an  
outrage committed in the name of the law.

No. 7. Calls upon the Government to  
appoint a commission to take evidence  
under oath, make a full inquiry into the  
circumstances, mete out punishment,  
refund monies paid, and allow damages  
to the parties aggrieved.

No. 8. Pledges the farmers who were  
present (about 70 we believe) to work  
and vote against the government candi-  
date in the next election in Western  
Assiniboia.

No. 9. Strongly denounces the person  
they believe to have been the prime  
mover in the matter.

No 10. provides for sending copies of  
the resolutions to the papers for publi-  
cation.

No 11. appointed H. Hassard, G  
Zaiser, and J. Bohner, junior, to be a  
committee, with power to add to their  
number, to lay the matter before the  
Government, and with power to call a  
meeting at any time and report progress  
and recommend the course they think  
fit.
