Fielding Services Given Recognition

A signal recognition of the long and distinguished public service of Right Hoa. W. S. Fielding, Minister of Finance, is provided in the supplementary estimates tabled in the House of Com. mons by Hon. James A. Robb acting Minister of Finance. An annuity at the rate of \$10,000 is asked for, that annuity to commence upon his retirement from public life and to continue thereafter at the above rate during his lifetime.

It is about 18 or 20 months ago that Mr. Fielding, owing to illness, was compe led to relinquish active connection with the administration of which he had 1921. Since that time he has been un-lissue. able to take any part in public affairs while at the same time he has retained his intellectua! vigor and continues to manifest a lively interest in the business of Canada's Government.

As his health will not permit him to take any part in the forthcoming elecion it is evident that his tenure of the Nova Scotia seat-Queens-will terminate with the dissolution of this four. teenth parliament, and when that time comes he will, it is understood, tender his resignation both as member and as Minister of Finance. Until that time he wi'l have continued to draw his salary, as minister and his indemnity as a member, and the sum asked for in the estimates is to provide for his needs after the dissolution of Parliament.


