W. S. FIELDING MAKES HOUSE TAKE NOTICE

Makes one of the two Outstanding Speeches of the Present Session of the Commons.

Ottawa, March 15.—Parliament heard yesterday the two outstanding speeches of the present session. From the Opposition benches Hon. W. S. Fielding discussed in masterly fashion the great issues of the day, and concluded an able summing up of the tariff situation with a dramatic appeal to the Western members to "choose ye this day whom ye will serve." He told them they would have to belong to one or other of the old political parties, and expressed his firm belief that, considering the past performances of the Liberal party with respect to tariff reform and freer trade, they had more to hope from that party than from any other.

No Election Just Now

While standing for Liberal principles, Mr. Fielding made it clear in his closing remarks that he is not in favor of a change of Government at the present time. He said he would continue to give the Government his independent support, although he would hold himself free to vote as

he saw fit. It was not in the best interest of the country that a general election should be held now, he said.

Chars For Fielding.
Hon. Mr. Fielding was in line form and his skill as a debater was never better demonstrated. His remarks were vigorously and repeatedly applauded by the members of the Opposition and when he had concluded he received an ovation.

Hon. Mr. Creer vigorously applauded Mr. Fielding's remarks about the tariff.

LOUTH COUNCIL

The Council met pursuant to adjournment at Frank's Hall, Jordan, on Monday, March 10th, 1919, at 10 a.m. All the members were present. The minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

A petition was presented to the Council, signed by George Eller and large number of others, requesting the Council to improve the road between lots 16 and 17 in the 5th concession by cutting down the two hills on said road and widening the road at the foot of the hill known as the "Winding Hill."

A communication was received from the Minister of Agriculture confirming the Township-by-law appointing fruit tree inspectors for 1919.

A request was received from the St. Catharines School Board, asking that the school taxes of Separate School supporters in the Township be paid over to said Separate School Board.

A letter from L. S. Dessey, Esq., Clerk of Grantham, was received, respecting work on the town line between Grantham and Louth.

A communication was received from W. A. Clarke, Esq., clerk of the township of York, relating to the tax on dogs.

On motion of S. M. Honsberger and P. F. Bowslough the Reeve and Clerk were authorized to sign and submit to the department of Public Highways of Ontario the statement showing payments made to the Road Superintendent on account of his salary.

On motion of S. M. Honsberger and A. C. Gregory the Reeve and Treasurer were authorized to sell the debentures for the Louth Hydro Electric Commission or service.

On motion of Wm. Honsberger and P. F. Bowslough the auditor's report of their audit of the Township accounts for 1918 was received and adopted.

On motion of Wm. Honsberger and A. E. Gregory the petition of George Eller and other residents of Division No. 1 was referred to a committee consisting of the whole Council.

On motion of Wm. Honsberger and A. C. Gregory a by-law was introduced to borrow money for current expenditures.

On motion of P. F. Bowslough and S. M. Honsberger the said by-law was read a second and third time.

On motion of A. C. Gregory and W. Honsberger a by-law was introduced to authorize the borrowing of money for the Hydro Electric service of the township of Louth.

On motion of S. M. Honsberger and P. F. Bowslough the said by-law was read a second and third time.

On motion of S. M. Honsberger and P. F. Bowslough the clerk was instructed to advertise for applications for road superintendent for the Township of Louth for 1919, services to commence on 31st May, 1919. Applications to be received on or before the 12th of April, 1919.

On motion of Wm. Honsberger and S. M. Honsberger P. F. Bowslough and A. C. Gregory were appointed a committee with power to sell the timber on the road allowance between lots 6 and 7 in the 5th and 6th concessions and also in 2nd and 3rd concessions of the Township of Louth known as the "Jolly Cut."

On motion of A. C. Gregory and P. F. Bowslough M. A. Ball, clerk, was appointed Treasurer for the Hydro-Electric Power Commission for the Township of Louth.

On motion of S. M. Honsberger and A. C. Gregory a number of accounts were paid.

On motion of P. F. Bowslough and S. M. Honsberger the Council adjourned to meet again at Frank's Hall Jordan, on Monday, April 14th, 1919, at 10 a.m.
