Mr. S. E. REID, of Tryon was chosen at the convention on Thursday last to contest the Fourth District of Prince, in the interests of the government, at the coming by-election.

In the North Hastings election for the Ontario Legislature, Allen, Conservative, has a majority of 580. In the last general election Haggerty, Liberal, had a majority of 50.

At the Liberal-Conservative convention in Centerville on Friday, Mr. Neil McQuarrie, Q. C. was selected to contest the Fourth District of Prince at the approaching election for the Provincial Legislature.

At the Liberal convention in Ludlow Hall, Summerside, Mr. R. C. McLeod was selected as the government candidate for the Fifth District of Prince. The nomination was first tendered by Mr. George Godkin, who declined to accept.

A St. John's, N.B., despatch of the 31st ult., says Sir Herbert Murray, Governor of Newfoundland sent the charter and charts concerning proposed fortifications there and the establishment of a naval reserve among the fisheries by the British cruiser Pelican, on the 30th.

A DESPATCH of the 31st ult., from London says there is no reason to believe the French Government intends to make any proposition regarding French shore rights in Newfoundland. Liberais suggest that England should give up compensation for the whole right bank of the Niger and certain territory toward Lake Tchad.

CHINA has granted the demand for an extension of an exclusive British settlement in Shanghai, notwithstanding Sir Claude Macdonald's protest to the consular. The Chinese Viceroy is greatly displeased with Great Britain for failing to uphold his determined policy in the valley of the Yang Tse Kiang.

PREMIER Farquharson left on Friday morning en route to Ottawa, where he has been called with Premier Murray of Nova Scotia, and Premier Emerson of New Brunswick. It is said that these premiers will meet the Government's in Ottawa, and discuss the report of the Privy Council in re the fisheries claim of the Provincers.

POSTMASTER general of the United States has signed an order accepting as private mailing cards both Canadian mailing cards bearing United States postage, and those mailed on the line and United States cards mailed in Canada with Canadian postage. This is the result of a reciprocity arrangement between this and the Canadian Government.

A DESPATCH of the 31st ult. from Port Dalhousie, Ont., reports the burning of the Toronto Rubber Company's plant and the Lawrie gnat mill, on that morning. The fire broke out in its factory boiler room. The Rubber Co. had fifty thousand dollars worth of rubber on hand, and their loss is estimated at one hundred thousand dollars. The gnat mill loss is five thousand.

The trial of the petition against the return of Amielio Gallant, for the First District of Prince, began at Alberton on Wednesday last, before Judge Hodgson, and continued till Thursday afternoon, when the petitioner's case closed, and the Court adjourned until February 7th next. Of the eleven charges or counts in the petition, three were dismissed and two abandoned. Evidence was heard in the remaining six, which are now open for rebuttal and argument.
