Sessional Proceedings.

At the opening of the third Session of thirty-seventh general Assembly of this Province on Wednesday last, His Honour, the Lieut. Governor, delivered the following speech: Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly:— In welcoming you to this the Thirty-seventh General Assembly of Prince Edward Island, it gives me great pleasure to state that during the past year Providence has favoured us with a prosperity and development unsurpassed in this Island's history.

I voice the heartfelt sentiments of all our people in welcoming back to Canada Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Connaught, who have in an especial manner endeared themselves to the people of this Island.

The past year has been, in general, favourable for Agriculture, and a bountiful harvest has been secured, although considerable damage was done in some sections by heavy and long continue rains.

Live Stock conditions have improved, and the poultry industry has been much advanced through the work carried on by the Federal Department of Agriculture in the care and marketing of eggs.

The increased grain received under "The Agriculture Aid Act," enabled the Government to make progress in organizing a complete system of Agricultural Education, correlated with the general system. Short Courses in House hold Science have been established in Prince of Wales College. Long and Short Courses in Agriculture have been arranged, part of the instruction being given in Prince of Wales College, and practical instruction in Agriculture provided for those who are qualifying for teachers for our public schools.

In addition to this, a Science Course was arranged for teachers who are now in charge of our schools and provision made for Women's institutes, supervised by competition, ladies, to work with the schools for the improvement of rural conditions. To carry on this work, an addition was built to the Agricultural Hall which is also being found very serviceable for Agricultural gatherings of various kinds. A further extension of these several lines of work which have been initiated, will, in the near future, complete a system of education in keeping with the requirements of an Agricultural Province.

As a further aid to agriculture, it is expected that during next summer a self-loading and self-discharging dredge for oyster mud will be put in operation by my Government with a view to establishing a system for making this great fertilizer available to our farmers generally at the lowest possible cost.

In educational matters, the past year has been one of marked progress. The amendments to The Public Schools Act, whereby this Government undertook to duplicate the supplements raised by the school districts, and also to pay the teachers a per capita bonus on the average daily attendance, have been effective in securing better attendance, better work and in preventing to a great extent the exodus of the best class of teachers.

The problem of securing a thorough professional training for teachers has been engaging the earnest consideration of the Government. As a first step towards its solution, a very successful Summer School for teachers was held in Prince of Wales College during the Summer vacation. The best instructors available were secured, and for two weeks nearly half the teachers of the Province devoted themselves assiduously to acquiring greater skill in their profession. In the improved work of many of the teachers in the rural schools the beneficial effects of this "Short Course" for teachers is plainly discernible. It is the intention of the Government to further develop this course.

venting to a great extent the exodus of the best class of teachers. Our people have shown their appreciation of these benefits by the greatly increased amounts voted for school purposes, and also by a general awakening to a keen interest in educational matters.

The problem of securing a thorough professional training for teachers has been engaging the earnest consideration of the Government. As a first step towards its solution, a very successful Summer School for teachers was held in Prince of Wales College during the Summer vacation. The best instructors available were secured, and for two weeks nearly half the teachers of the Province devoted themselves assiduously to acquiring greater skill in their profession. In the improved work of many of the teachers in the rural schools the beneficial effects of this "Short Course" for teachers is plainly discernible. It is the intention of the Government to further develop this course.

The appointment of an additional teacher in the Model School has made it possible to give more attention than ever in the past to the professional side of the work of the student teachers in attendance at Prince of Wales College.

The Government has had under consideration for some time the obtaining of better and cheaper school books and school supplies and arranging for their distribution, so that the pupils in even the remotest schools may have no difficulty in obtaining all needed school equipment. You will be asked to consider the best means of securing these results.

The development of Fox farming has continued at an increasing ratio. The specially favourable conditions of climate, soil and expert knowledge in the breeding of silver foxes has led to a marvellous growth of this industry to the great profit of the breeders and of the Province generally.

The introduction of Karakul sheep breeding promises to make an important addition to the industries of our Province. The oyster fisheries, which had once been prolific, were by overfishing, want of adequate protection and, by the increase of star fish, verging on extinction, now promise to become a great source of provincial wealth and in time to give profitable and continuous employment to large numbers of our citizens.

An Interprovincial Conference was held in Ottawa in October last at which every Province in Canada was represented. Several of the questions considered were of the first importance, and we confidently hope that as a result of the presentation of claims before this Conference and the Government of Canada, full justice will be done. The official report of the proceedings will be laid before you.

The Fiftieth Anniversary of the first Confederation Conference to be celebrated here during the present year will mark a period of the first importance to all Canada. It will particularly mark the fulfilment of the Confederation agreement by linking up this Island with the transportation system of Canada and the improved financial terms and conditions which at length have put this Province on a solvent and progressive basis in the Confederation.

A Joint Stock Companies Act and other important legislation will be submitted for your consideration. The Accounts of the Revenue and Expenditure for the past year and the Reports of the various Departments of the Government together with the Estimates for the current year, will be laid before you. To these and all other matters that may be submitted to

you I invite your earnest attention. I now invoke upon your labors the blessings of Divine Providence in the confident assurance that the results of your deliberations will greatly benefit our people.

After his Honour had taken his departure, Hon. Mr. Stewart, acting Premier, introduced the usual pro forma bill, which was read a first time. The House then proceeded with the appointment of committees and the routine usual on opening day. The address in reply to the speech was made the first order for the following day. The House then adjourned.

On Thursday afternoon the House met at 3 o'clock. After the reading of the Journal and other ordinary routine, the order of the day was taken up. Mr. A. P. Prowse moved, seconded by Mr. L. L. Jenkins, that the following address be presented to His Honour the Lieut. Governor: "To His Honour the Honourable Benjamin Rogers, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Prince Edward Island: We, His Majesty's loyal subjects of the Legislative Assembly of Prince Edward Island, at this time in session assembled, beg leave to offer our humble thanks to Your Honour for the gracious speech with which Your Honour has been pleased to open the present session."

Mr. Prowse supported his motion in an exhaustive speech. Referring to the first paragraph in the speech which emphasized the prosperity of the Province during the past year, he said, our farming and fishing industries are a source of great wealth, much of it not yet developed. Although much had already been accomplished in this direction, he considered that we were just entering on a period of remarkable development. Referring to the high cost of living, he pointed out that the farmers were now receiving greater prices for their products than ever before. As to the fisheries, he showed that remarkable advancement had been made in the prosecution thereof. The introduction of motor boats in to our coast fisheries had multiplied many fold the volume of this industry. Regarding the paragraph in the speech expressing pleasure at the return to this Dominion of their Royal Highnesses, the Duke and Duchess of Connaught, he felt sure it aroused an enthusiastic response in every loyal heart. It was something to be extremely proud of that we were citizens of this great Dominion, a member of the great world wide British Empire. To live here and have for our Governor-General the son of the beloved Queen Victoria, was a happy privilege. He considered that we were highly privileged to be citizens of this Province, which was bound, he felt sure, to become in every respect the most desirable part of the Dominion to live in. Our agricultural outlook was the highest and the financial assistance granted by the Federal Government had already effected remarkable advancement, and the various courses inaugurated in the different departments are opening up unanticipated lines of development and improvement. He considered the idea put forward by the Government to tender the oyster mud fertilizer easy of acquisition to our farmers, a matter of great importance. Taking up the question of education, he reviewed the operations of the past quarter of a century. Our schools, he pointed out, had deteriorated; but the present Government had changed all that, and now we have better schools and better teachers, and greater interest is taken in education by the people generally. There is now a

Mr. L. L. Jenkins seconded the address. He thought the paragraph in the speech, emphasizing our agricultural prosperity, was truer now than ever before in the speech of any previous Lieutenant Governor. He considered that we should feel thankful to the present Government at Ottawa for the great interest they have taken in the Maritime Provinces, instead of pouring all the money into the west, as had been customary under the late Liberal Federal Government. Mr. Jenkins addressed himself briefly to the different paragraphs of the speech. Regarding the beef industry, he considered it might be much improved. It was not right that beef cattle should be imported from Ontario to this agricultural country, as was largely going on at present. We should have more manufactures in our midst. The sum of over \$26,000 received from the Federal Government last year in aid of our agricultural industry, was most generous and had been of inestimable benefit to that industry here. Improvements had been effected in every branch of our agricultural industry. He considered that great improvements had been effected in all departments of our educational system. He considered the Maritime Provinces and especially Prince Edward Island far the best part of Canada.

Mr. Richards, Leader of the Opposition, commenced to speak at 4.50. After complimenting the mover and second of the address, he entered upon a general criticism of the Government's policy. At 5.40 he moved the adjournment of the debate. The House then adjourned to Monday 16th.
