Old Glory Sale at New York.

MR. J. JUDGE BUYS FAST HORSES.

We notice by late Canadian papers that at the annual Old Glory sale held recently at New York. Mr. J. Judge has bought several fast horses. The paper that we take the clipping from gives Mr. Judge's address as Halifax, but we understand that it is Mr. Joseph Judge of this city. The item reads:—

MORE HORSES FOR PROVINCES.

Besides Molivera, 2.30, and Frisco, Direct, 2.24 $\frac{1}{2}$, bought respectively by Joseph Judge, Halifax, and Hammond Kelly, Charlottetown, as already reported, several other purchases were made at the New York Old Glory Sale. Nova Scotians have been prominent at these sales for years in purchasing the first horse on the catalogue. Jas. D. Keith, New Glasgow, at several sales made such purchases, and at the recent sale Mr. Judge of Halifax bought the initial offering. Pettilian, 2.18 $\frac{1}{2}$, bay stallion, 11 years old, by Peter the Great, 2.07 $\frac{1}{2}$, dam Tullian, half sister to Mary Todd, 1.45 $\frac{1}{2}$, Gen. Star, 3.14 $\frac{1}{2}$, by Cecilian, (2) 2.25, by Electioneer. Pettilian trotted a trial in 2:07 $\frac{1}{4}$ as a four year old. Mr. Judge paid \$100 for him.

Mr. Judge also purchased Princess Ambit, chestnut trotting mare, 10 years old, by Robert King, 2.17 $\frac{1}{2}$, dam Ambit, 2.23 $\frac{1}{2}$, by Ambassador, 2.21 $\frac{1}{4}$. She is a full sister to King Ambit, 2.12 $\frac{1}{4}$, but never been trained. She has been broken to single and double and has been driven by a young woman. She was sold for \$80.

Hints For Your Home.

Bamboo furniture should be cleaned with warm salt and water, and polished with a soft cloth.

An excellent method of removing onion odours from a knife is to dip the knife two or three times in some earth.

Never keep vinegar in a stone jar. The acid affects the glazing, and renders the vinegar unwholesome. Glass jars are the best.

A few drops of ammonia added to the water when washing flannel and woollen garments will make them soft and help to keep them a good colour.

If gas brackets, owing to their position, corrode and look unsightly, clean them, and then paint with cycle enamel. An alternative is to use aluminium paint.

Obtain a stone ginger-beer bottle, knit a cover for it, or make one out of a bit of flannel, and you have a good foot-warmer for baby's cot or pram. Warm the bottle before filling it.

When you find that the sink is stopped up, turn on the tap until the sink is three-quarters full; then turn it off. Put the palm of your hand flat over the hole, and lift your hand up and down very quickly. This will soon make the water run away.

To save broken buttons and the holes cut by them, take the buttons off the shirt front and in their place make buttonholes. Then stitch the buttons on to a broad piece of tape and slip them through the made buttonholes. They may then be removed for washing, and the one set of buttons will serve for every shirt.

Rinse coloured frocks and blouses in a solution of one ounce of Epsom salt and two quarts of water.

To remove iron rust from lace, use lemon-juice and salt and expose to the sunshine. If stains will not yield to treatment, a white lace that is spotted may be given an ecrú tint by rinsing in coffee.

Mildew on linen may be removed by rubbing well with soap and scraping a little chalk over it. Spread in the sun to bleach, and as it dries damp it a little. It should be left in the air all day, and then washed.

Blouses or garments which have lost their original brightness or colour may be readily made perfectly white by boiling for twenty minutes in water to which has been added cream of tartar, one teaspoonful to a pall of water.
