Moved by Mr Ramsey, see, by Mr. B. H. Kean, that this Council at its earliest convenience proceed by Committee to examine the different reads complained of, with a view to having them repaired, and report at the next meeting of Council. Mesers. J. Kean and Ramsey to visit places from the base line to Lots No. 16, and Mesers B. H. Kean, the said Lots to the townline.—Carried. On motion the Council adjourned to meet as a Court of Revision and Appeal. The sum of \$200 was deducted from Thomas Simpson's assessment and \$110 added to Edward Thomas', and on motion made and seconded, the Court was closed and Council resumed, and ordered that \$70 be paid to Duncan Campbell , Assessor for the present year. It was resolved that six days' notice be given to the Township Treasurer by parties who may in future have orders on him as Treasurer, allowing him time to draw the necessary sum. It was ordered that all Notes of Hand held by the Treasurer, belonging to this municipality, the time of which is about to xpire, be collected forthwith. The Council adjourned to meet on Saturday, 30th o
