Having from his breed a natural turn for fighting, he distinguished himself throughout the campaign. Don't Spoil a Sneeze.—The Spring-field (Mass.) Republican says:—"One may be pardoned for sneezing under any circumstances, in view of the experience of a woman from this city in Westfield, recently. Being in company, and attempting to suppress a sneeze, she felt a queer sensation in the left side of her face, which soon began swelling and drawing out of shape. A physician was called, but by the time he arrived her mouth and the left side of her face had become drawn up, disfiguring her so that her most intimate friends could scarcely recognize her features, while she found it impossible to close her left eye. The physicians say it is a kind of paralysis, caused by the great effort she made in suppressing the sneeze, and give but faint hopes that her features will ever resume their natural appearance. She is now in this city seeking medical advice."

GLUE AS A HEALING AGENT.—A correspondent of the Scientific American adds his testimony as to the value of using glue as a healing agent for cuts, bruises, etc. He says:—"I have used glue for this purpose for the last 22 years, mostly in the cabinet shop, and never employ anything else. I have received many severe cuts and bruises, and never lost any time, to speak of. Often a piece of thin cloth is sufficient after gluing over the wound. I use the best imported glue. I never took cold in a wound yet, and it is the most speedy healing agent I ever employed. Last autumn an acquaintance of mine came into the shop with his hand all bundled up. He had received a severe bruise on the back of his hand, and took cold in it; and it was badly inflamed. I spread a plaster of melted glue ever the wound and bound a moistened cloth over it to keep the glue from becoming dry. In one week his hand was entirely well." Just melt the glue, and apply it cott.




