IN AN ENDEAVOR to safeguard motorists and pedestrians, Attorney-General Manson announces a new regulation affecting the use of spotlights on motor vehicles. The new regulation reads:

"No motor vehicle shall be equipped with more than one spotlight and the bereaved family. the beam of light therefrom, when such motor vehicle is in motion, must always be directed to the right of the medial length line, and the beam of light from the said spotlight shall strike the ground on the right-hand side of the vehicle on which the spotlight is mounted, at a distance not exceeding 100 feet in front of the vehicle."
