Frederick Society Lectures.

The opportunity to see a play of Shakespeare, well presented, or to hear it ably discussed, is something that does not occur very often. The course of four Shakespearean lectures to be given by Dr. Moulton, under the auspices of the London Freebel Society, must rank as an event to lovers of Shakespeare. Of the plays considered in this course, "Richard III." and "Othello" may sometimes be seen on the stage; but the other two are less well known, although not less interesting. In "Richard III." Shakespeare pictures the "artistic villain," in "Othello" we have a drama of jealousy and intrigue. In every lecture Dr. Moulton brings breadth of view and profound knowledge to the interpretation of the play, and his audience sees with him the broad principles underlying these vivid pictures of human life, that are called the plays of Shakespeare. The lectures will be given in St. Andrew's Hall.

NOT SUFFICIENT WORK FOR THE VISITING NURSE

Hospital Trust Will Likely Withdraw Her Shortly—A Meeting Yesterday.

The hospital trust yesterday afternoon decided to withdraw the visiting nurse from duty, unless there was a more generous response from the medical men of the city.

This nurse was appointed three months ago, to visit patients suffering with tuberculosis, and care for them, and show how such patients should be treated.

Since her appointment just three cases have been reported, and these were not sufficient to keep her employed for any length of time.

A Difference.

"When we appointed the nurse there was no use to the effect that there were many such cases in the city, and such a nurse would do splendid service," said Chairman Screamton.

"We thought we could assist these patients, and wrote to the physicians asking for the names of any who might need a nurse, and also for other information. We have received no replies, and from what we can discover there are very few cases needing her attention. We can make money by keeping her in the hospital. If there is no response within a week we must withdraw the offer."

The other members agreed with the chairman, and the nurse will be taken from that work at the end of the week if no more cases are reported.

At the request of the physicians in charge it was decided to change the hours for the outdoor dispensary from 1:30 to 3 o'clock, to 1 to 2:30 o'clock.

Graduating Exercises.

The graduating exercises of the Nurses' Training School will be held on May 19, and Chairman Screamton was named to make the necessary arrangements.

Tenders for the coal supply will be called for at once, and they will be considered at a special meeting to be held next week to appoint house surgeons.

Hon. Adam Beck wrote stating that he will ask the Government landscape gardener to lay out the grounds of the new Institute and the new Isolation Hospital.

Superintendent Heard's Report.

The superintendent's report showed that there were 166 patients admitted during the month of March—68 males, 59 females and 39 children. During the same period 177 were discharged—67 males, 69 females and 41 children. There were 13 births, 11 deaths and 64 operations. There were 128 patients receiving treatment on March 31. The receipts for the month were \$220 94.

The donations for the month were periodicals from Harold Percy, magazines from H. Cooke and Mrs. T. H. Carling. The Bible Flower Mission donated flowers for Easter Sunday.

The inspection showed the boilers to be in first-class condition.
